4. A signed letter from the clerk of your Tribal Court or current sitting Tribal Court Judge (written on a Tribal Court letterhead) certifying that you will be allowed to practice in the specified Tribal Court once you complete the Certificate in Tribal Court Legal Advocacy.

Please make sure that you have submitted all the necessary documents. Students who apply or complete their applications after the deadline will be considered on a space available basis. Incomplete applications will be considered after completed applications have been reviewed. Applicants will be notified of their application status on or before January 20, 2021. The online course will begin on February 1, 2021 and end on June 27, 2021. The final 40-hours of interactive training will be held July 12-16, 2021.

The in-person training will be held from July 12-16, 2021 at the University of Wisconsin Law School in Madison, Wisconsin. In order to participate in the graduation ceremony and to receive a certificate, students must be on time each day and be present for all 40 hours of the in-person training.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS:

In the event that the in-person training is not available due to COVID-19 restrictions, students will be required to attend a virtual, interactive training which will be held online July 12 – 16, 2021. Students must be available the entire week and must actively participate in the live presentations in order to receive their certificate. Students will receive their certificates through the mail.
